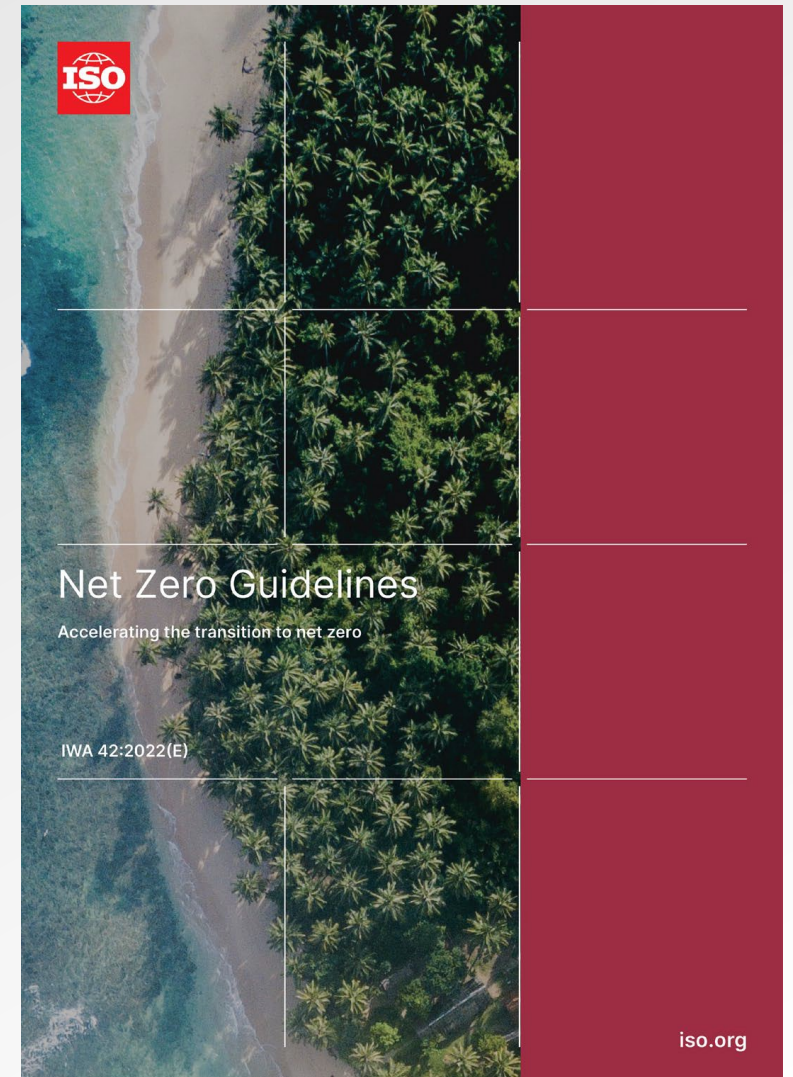
What they do (and why you should use them)?
