LOCAL INFORMATION (Including Travel and Weather)

Connectivity & Free Public Wi-Fi

There is free WiFi in the four public squares in the center of Delft, and most hotels and other tourist attractions also have free WiFi.

Currency & Banking

The Netherlands is part of the European Union (EU). You have to pay in Euros in the Netherlands. Most shops and restaurants will accept credit cards and bank debit cards. There are plenty of ATMs where you can make cash withdrawals.

Drinking Water

In the Netherlands, tap water is so clean and high quality that you can drink it straight from the tap without worrying about quality or safety. You can also buy bottled water easily.

Emergency Services

If you need urgent (medical) help or are in a life-threatening situation, call the national emergency number 112. If you need help, but it is not an emergency, call 0900-8844 (the police switchboard). Hopefully, you will never need to contact the emergency services, but please enter both numbers on your telephone!

Explore Delft

For more information, please browse Explore Delft, which will provide more details on See & Do, Festivals & Events, Eat & Drink, Shop, Stay, Tours, and more. The shops in the Netherlands and Delft usually open at 9.00 or 9.30 am and close at 5.30 or 6.00 pm. Monday is an exception: most shops in the center open at 1.00 pm on Mondays. Most supermarkets have longer opening hours, opening at 8.00 am and closing late in the evening.

Getting Around Delft

Delft is well connected with a range of public transport options. In Delft, buses, trams, and trains are easily accessible. For shorter trips within the city, the bus and tram provide a simple way to get around. Visit here for more information.

Language

In Delft, like everywhere else in the Netherlands, the local people speak Dutch. However, most Dutch people can speak English and will gladly help you. So feel free to ask a resident for directions if lost.

Mobile Networks and Internet

Anyone can access various providers' 4G mobile networks almost everywhere in the Netherlands. Roaming charges no longer exist for phone providers in the European Union. Please note: if you come from a country outside the EU, you will still have to pay roaming charges. If you want to avoid paying extra charges in a foreign country, switch your telephone to airplane mode or deactivate roaming. There is free WiFi in the four public squares in the center of Delft, and most hotels and other tourist attractions also have free WiFi.

Power Plugs

The Netherlands uses a 230 Volt power supply with Type C/F plugs.

Time Zone and Summer Time

The Netherlands and Delft are in the Central European time zone. The Netherlands also has summertime (or daylight saving time). At the end of March, the clocks go forward one hour, and at the end of October, the clocks go back one hour to standard Central European Time.

Tipping

In the Netherlands, giving a small tip when you pay for lunch, drinks, or dinner is customary, but it isn't compulsory. If you are unsure how much you "ought" to tip, give around 10% of the total bill.

Travel Documents

You will need a valid passport and proof of identity to visit the Netherlands. Carry proof of identity with you always in the Netherlands, as the law requires. It means that everyone aged 14 and over has to produce a valid identity document if asked to do so by the police.

Weather

In March, <u>Delft</u> typically experiences low temperatures and moderate rainfall. Throughout the day, temperatures typically settle at around 11°C. But by evening, they drop to around 4°C.

What to Pack

Attire is business casual for the conference during the day. We recommend you dress in layers as temperatures in meeting rooms can vary. Some events may occur outside in the evening when the weather cools down, so be sure to bring appropriate clothing options.
